    - Ongoing collaboration with Vineyard Committee on Water Permit Workshop Part of the Proposal: Fish Friendly Farming x AVWA Environmental Committee How Fish Friendly Farming Certification Can Help with Your Vineyard's Water Board Permit.
      - 1. Create proposal and outline what this will entail and which stakeholders
      - 2. About the upcoming Water Permit:
        - All vineyard parcels subject to the General Permit regardless of slope of the planted area - must achieve performance standards for soil erosion in the farm area, and for discharge of nutrients and pesticides.
        - b. The proposed project consists of the Regional Water Board establishing General WDRs for Vineyard Properties to control discharges of sediment and

stormwater runoff originating from Vineyard Properties located within the project boundaries. Vineyard Properties have the potential to discharge pollutants to surface water and groundwater from stormwater and irrigation runoff, the application of pesticides and fertilizer, erosion of sediment, and removal and suppression of riparian vegetation. The proposed Vineyard Permit will require Dischargers to assess, plan, and implement a suite of site-specific actions and best management practices (BMPs) targeted towards controlling discharges from Vineyard Properties including their:

- i. Related Vineyard Facilities,
- ii. Road networks,
- iii. Gullies and shallow landslides, and
- iv. Points of concentrated stormwater runoff.
